## Senex makes a \$500,000 splash in Roma



Senex made a splash in November announcing its \$500,000 investment in the redevelopment of the Roma community pool.

Senex Energy CEO Darren Stevenson said the investment reflected Senex's commitment to building strong and vibrant regional communities in its areas of operation.

"We have been here for a decade and will be here for decades to come, and we are proud to deliver an

investment that will improve the vibrancy and liveability of the Maranoa," Mr Stevenson said.

The redevelopment will feature a 50-metre outdoor heated pool, a 25-metre indoor program pool for lessons and therapy, a vibrant water play area for young families, swim club facilities and fully accessible amenities.

This is just one-way Senex can give back to a community that has given us so much.

## Expansion project complete

Senex has delivered its more than **A\$1 billion Surat Basin expansion project** ahead of schedule.

Expansion highlights:

- **First gas delivered to Australian households and manufacturers** in Q1 2025
- Senex continues to deliver for the east coast market with **70% of production** supplied to **Australian mining, manufacturing, retail and power generation** customers.
- **Atlas East compression facility** construction complete in 13 months.
- **Roma North compression facility and sales gas pipeline** completed more than three months ahead of schedule
- **Atlas to Reedy Creek Pipeline** constructed in five months and sold to APA in four months
- Doubled **total treated water storage capacity** at Roma North resulting in additional **122% of irrigation under construction** at Roma North
- A 62% increase in **community investment** for 2025
- Almost **\$300m spent with Queensland-based suppliers** in 2025
- **264 wells drilled** throughout the expansion program totalling more than **155kms of drilling**.

## Did you know?

The Queensland Government recently announced its *Queensland Energy Roadmap*, identifying the **need for at least 2.6 GW of new gas-powered generation (GPG) by 2035.**

As the share of renewables grows, the need for gas as a firming and reliable source of energy is increasing.

The *Energy Roadmap* outlines plans to deliver more than **700 MW of new GPG capacity** by 2032, including CS Energy's 400 MW Brigalow Gas Peaker **supplied by Senex's Atlas field.**

GPG is rapidly growing as a transitional energy source, emitting around **half the carbon of a typical coal-fired power station.**

The Australian Energy Market Operator described renewable energy connected by transmission and distribution, firmed with storage and **backed up by gas** as the **least-cost way** to supply secure and reliable electricity to consumers in its [Draft 2026 Integrated System Plan](#).

It provides stable baseload power that delivers reliable and relatively low-cost electricity generation for Australia **day and night, rain, hail or shine.**

## Senex to deliver reliable energy to Queenslanders

Queensland's first new natural gas power station in more than a decade will be fuelled by Senex's locally produced gas.

From 2027, Senex will supply up to 58.4 petajoules of natural gas from its Atlas development to CS Energy's proposed Brigalow Peaking Power Plant to be built near Chinchilla in Queensland's Western Downs.

Once operational, the 400-megawatt gas peaking

power plant will have the ability to deliver full output within five minutes, powering more than 150,000 Queensland homes during peak demand periods.

The role of natural gas has never been more important as the share of renewables grows in Queensland's electricity grid.
